

To better accommodate all the various activities that need to happen on the ice at one time, we are implementing some new music and vest procedures.

## Vest Rules

1. **When it's your turn to play music, you receive vest privileges.** Remember to wear a vest as it gives you right-of-way. If you are not wearing a vest, you do not have the right of way regardless of if your music is playing.
2. Do not put the vest on and skate around until it is your turn. When you are done with your program, take the vest off.
3. Only the skater(s) whose music is playing has vest privileges.

## Music Rules

1. Add your name to the white board queue to hold your place for your program, dance, or skating skills pattern run. Your name may only be listed in the queue once.
2. **You may have vest privileges a maximum of two times per 30 min segment if the queue allows.** This applies regardless of if the skater is in a lesson or not. Once your music has played for 30 seconds or more, you must re-enter the queue to restart your program.
3. You may practice skating skills patterns with the vest, but must play music distinct from background music. You may do two patterns back to back, but that completes your access to vest privileges for this 30 min segment.
4. A skater may be bumped by a coach a maximum of two times.
5. Each coach is allotted 2 cuts per 30 min segment.
6. If there is no music monitor, there is a single queue for all skaters.
7. If there is no queue and a skater would like to play their music additional times, they must ask the monitor for permission first.
8. If you are unsure, ask the monitor.
9. During peak times, these rules are subject to change based on music monitor discretion.

## Earbud Use on Club Ice

1. Eligible figure skaters may only wear a single earbud during Club ice for safety reasons.
2. Figure skaters may use a single earbud to play their program music, dance test music, when choreographing a program, or during a virtual lesson. **Earbuds are not permitted for listening to background music.**
3. To be eligible to wear an earbud during Club ice, figure skaters must have passed Freeskate 1 and have their primary coach confirm that they have sufficient ice awareness.
4. When wearing an earbud, the figure skater must remain aware of and be considerate of the other figure skaters on the ice. If a figure skater is not doing this, the monitor will suspend this privilege until cleared by their primary coach.
